## **DESIGN BRIEF** (choose from the following options)

- 1. **Produce a surface pattern design concept** for fashion or interior products artwork can be visualised as a concept or produced as a final artefact. Any textile / surface design medium is acceptable. Final artworks and samples are to be mounted on one x A1 mount board
- 2. **Produce a fashion design concept collection** (minumum of three looks) consider how silhouette and fabric choices communicate your approach to the theme. Concept designs / illustrations must show front, back and side views and you can submit up to 1 x finished garment or toile to support your submission.

#### APPLIED + FINE ARTS BRIEF


